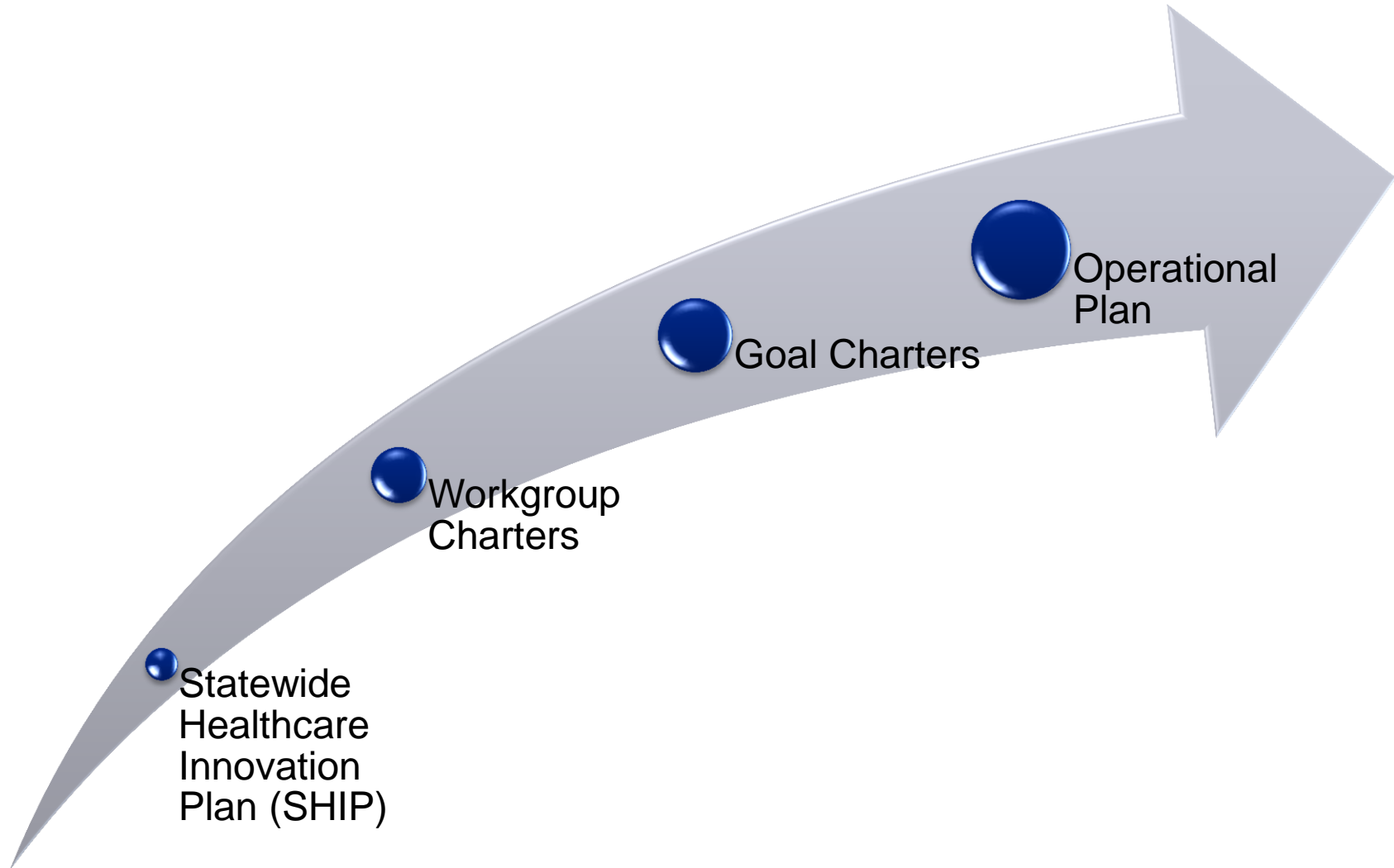

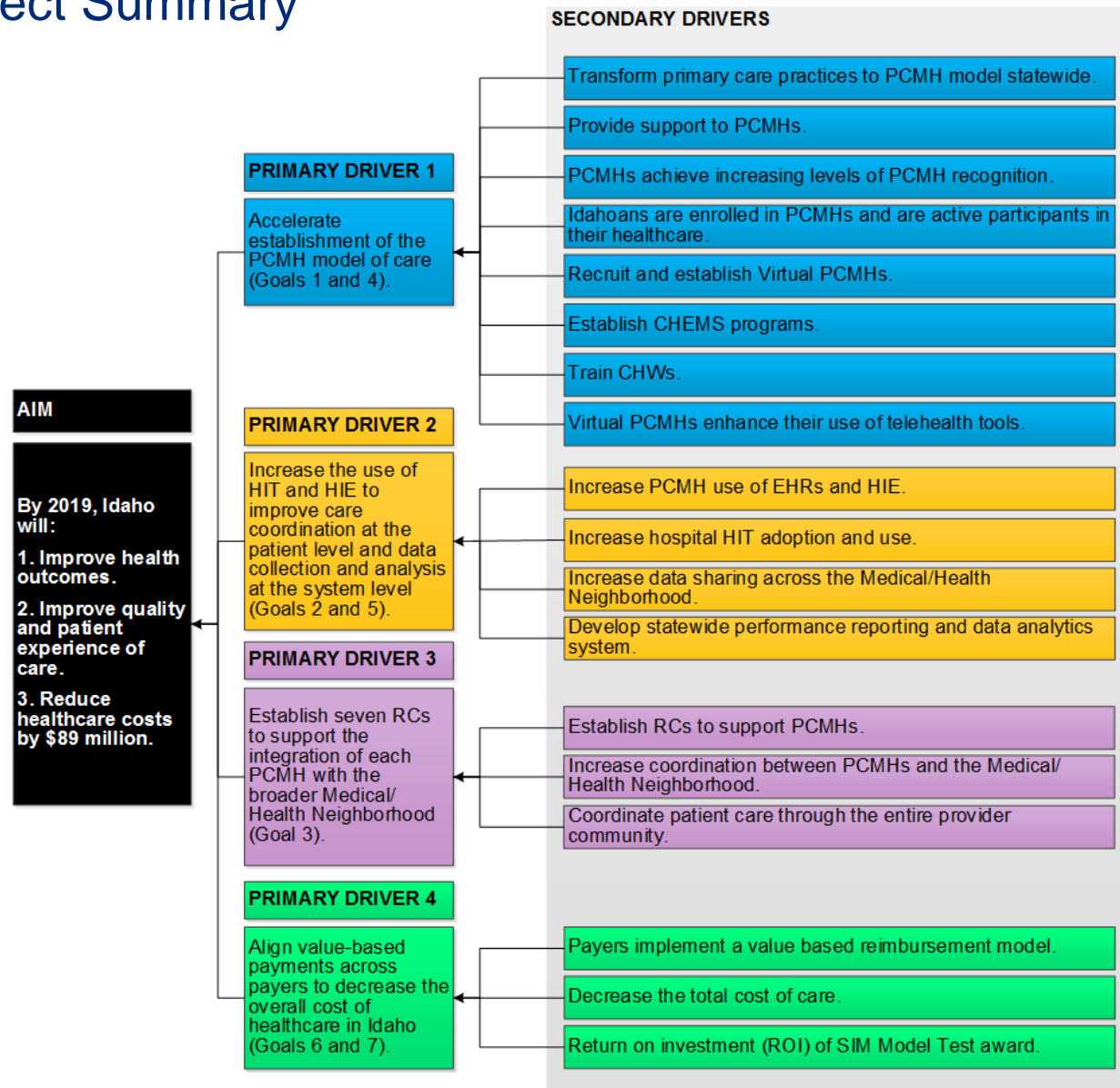
Operational Plan Overview and Purpose

- Requirement of all SIM Model Test states.
- Due to Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMMI) on December 1, 2015.
- CMMI approval of Year 2 grant funding contingent on approval of Operational Plan.
- Content and structure follows CMMI's guidance.
- Benefits of the Operational Plan:
 - Ensures common understanding between Idaho and CMMI.
 - Management tool to help Idaho organize activities and resources.
 - Monitoring document for CMMI and Idaho to keep the project on track.
