<b>Inventory of Work Occurring in Clinics</b>	Review revised list compiled by the Division of Public Health demonstrating activities being conducted in clinics statewide (includes 1305 grant, SHIP, Qualis)  Robert Graff discussed the interactive map provided to the group in the meeting appointment that identifies all of the clinics in Idaho involved with public health, SHIP and Qualis select initiatives. Other initiatives are to be added. The map was available during the meeting only as a test site and will shut down following the meeting. Robert explained the map in terms of functionality and asked for feedback from the group. There was extensive discussion among the group regarding changes, updates, and additions to the map. The map will be updated with the suggested changes and presented again at the next meeting through the support of a task group to identify inclusion criteria, quality, etc.. A short partner survey will be sent out at the end of August to gather information on statewide community health and results will be presented at the October meeting. Final draft of Get Healthy Idaho will hopefully be completed by November.</p> <p>It was noted that conversations have taken place in the public health sphere regarding data template creation to begin standardizing data requests.</p>		
<b>July 11 Spokane Forum</b>	<p>Discuss the July 11, 2016 meeting in Spokane and the agenda for the meeting</p> <p>Elke discussed the Spokane forum coming up in July. Region 10 Health and Human Services contact provided the public health 3.0 document which Elke presented to the group that describes the new approach for public health recommended by CDC. The Spokane forum will highlight leadership and workforce, data and analytics, infrastructure, funding, and partnerships as part of this new public health 3.0 model. <b>Population Health Data</b>	<p>Immunization Data</p> <p>Kathy Turner gave an update on the potential to use Immunization Data for population-based clinical data for SHIP due to its current accessibility. The immunization reminder and information system (IRIS) contains clinical records of children’s immunization records in Idaho. 54 of the 55 Cohort 1 clinics are enrolled in IRIS already. Rates can be immediately calculated by clinic. Community rates could be calculated as well, however, it would take a little longer. The timeline for this is potentially end of June at the clinic level.</p> <p>Discuss the status of the Network of Care site and the display of the population health measures and the Community Health Status Indicators 2015</p> <p>Joe Pollard updated the group on the Network of Care site and noted that they were denied source authority. This means that they can’t contract directly with the company that provides Network of Care. Joe walked the group through the site and explained how to use it.</p> <p>Elke reminded the group that the purpose of the Network of Care site is to display current population health data for RCs to use in decision making processes.</p>		
<p><b>CHEMS, CHW, Telehealth Update</b></p>	<p>The CHEMS, CHW and Telehealth Workgroups have been actively working and this presentation will provide a more in-depth overview of their work.</p> <p>Dieuwke Dizney-Spencer gave an update on the work that the Community Health Workers (CHW) are currently doing. There is now a contract in place with Idaho State University to deliver CHW training starting in the middle of June. Recruiting of instructors is currently taking place and the first Cohort of CHWs is set to start training this fall.</p> <p>The Telehealth subcommittee meeting is June 17<sup>th</sup> and will be finalizing an informal bid for PCMH Telehealth webinar learning series to be broadcast to the cohort 1 clinics.</p> <p>Wayne Denney gave an update on CHEMS. June 22<sup>nd</sup> will be the first meeting for the Workgroup. Wayne noted that if any of the PHW members are interested in being on the CHEMS Workgroup, there is space available. Training for administrators of EMS agencies interested in being involved with CHEMS will also take place at Ada County Paramedics on June 22<sup>nd</sup>. It was suggested that the CHEMS Workgroup could begin working on how to have conversations with hospital administrators, clinics, etc., on the importance of CHEMS.</p>	<p>Knowledge about the status of the virtual PCMH</p>	<p>Miro Barac Mary Sheridan</p>

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	<p>out of Westgate, and others around the state may attend via videoconferencing.</p> <p>Sonja Schreiver – There is a lifestyle coach training for the diabetes prevention program on June 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>. They have also been working on education for providers on why they might want to have a CHW.</p> <p>Cynthia York – Kate Creswell and Kym Schreiber created a spreadsheet on TCPI participation. Once reviewed and completed by Cynthia, she will send to Elke. Cynthia reminded the group of the date and time for the June IHC meeting.</p> <p>Region 7 – They are still working on the two selected measures; tobacco cessation and diabetes. Collecting the data by clinic for now until they can get data from the state.</p> <p>Region 6 – No update.</p> <p>Region 5 – Clinic visits have been taking place. They have also been getting their training completed.</p> <p>Region 4 – Continuing to work on improving ER and PCMH communication between St. Luke’s and St. Als. Due to the lack of availability of data, they are going to begin working with SHIP on collecting data directly from the clinics. In collaboration with diabetes coalition, a needs gap assessment will be sent out to the clinics to look at variations in staff training and education.</p> <p>Region 3 – Working on community health assessment and regional health improvement plan, in order to address data availability issues, they are using Oregon’s model as a base to form this plan. Collaborative is focusing on advanced care planning as well. A behavioral health integration workgroup is being formed in region 3 and plans to develop training opportunities. Building a business case for referral management tools and supports to bring to the IHC is on the agenda for their collaborative meeting this month.</p> <p>Region 2 – Planning next regional collaborative meeting for this month. Collecting clinic level data is number one on their priority list. They have also received interest from their clinics expressing their desire to look at local death records. Elke asked that Kayla send her a little</p>		

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	<p>more detailed information on what she can get from vital records.</p> <p>Region 1 – A presentation on CHEMS took place in their latest RC meeting. An expressed interest in having a NP in the ambulances, and to follow up on EMS progress in other counties was presented. Interested in what Cohort 1 clinics are doing for quality improvement and what measures they are using to find best practices on their activity to report back to the RC.</p>
