Idaho Wellness Guide	Review of Idaho Wellness Guide as a tool for the RCs – WEBNIAR https://global.gotomeeting.com/join/700344661 <i>Nicole Runner presented on the Idaho wellness guide. The Idaho Wellness Guide is an online resource directory mostly focused on chronic disease prevention and management resources but other wellness items as well.. Nicole reviewed the design of the wellness guide and how it will benefit primary health care providers. She discussed how the wellness guide is different from 2-1-1 CareLine and how these two resources will work cohesively going forward.</i> <i>Website URL is Wellness.idaho.gov and the site is live. Providers are encouraged to go online and register with the guide. Next steps are to continue to populate the guide with additional resources.</i> <i>Elke mentioned that the Live Better site, also sponsored by the Department to focus on connecting people to resources, just went live. 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<p>Together to Improve Coordination of Care”</p>	<p>Linda Rowe provided an overview of how Qualis Health is working to help Idaho PCMHs. Qualis Health is working with six coalitions on data collection, analysis and strategies for improvement in care transitions and reducing hospitalizations. Use of care coordination and standardization of processes through coordination of care were discussed.</p> <p>Martha Jaworski touched on their primary focus of bringing communities together. Identified who benefits most from working together with other organizations in care transition.</p> <p>There were questions asked about if this includes psychiatric readmissions (not at this time) and if it is possible to look at readmissions related to lack of proper nutrition after discharge. Qualis is also beginning to look at hospice care.</p> <p>DHW Time Sensitive Emergency System of Care Program will present on the six local TSE committees that are formed and meeting regularly.</p> <p>Christian Surjan reviewed the Time Sensitive Emergency (TSE) system of care that addresses trauma, heart attack (specifically a STEMI) and stroke. The program is about getting the right patient to the right place in the right time. Implementing the TSE, or similar structures, have been shown to reduce mortality from a time sensitive emergent condition by 25%. There are six TSE regions that were created to address patient care. The regions are based on referral patterns between EMS and the hospitals. Hospitals will voluntarily be designated as a leveled trauma, heart or stroke facility so EMS knows where to take patients.</p> <p>The TSE website (TSE.idaho.gov) contains the designation guidelines for hospitals and a complete standards manual for the program. <p>Definition of Population Health</p>	<p>Need to come up with a definition of population health</p> <p>(Handout) There was a robust conversation around the need to create a definition of population health. If a definition were created, should the group consider several definitions, beyond the PHWG application? For example, PHWG reviewed a document as a discussion starter, including definitions submitted by workgroup members, definitions used by healthcare, an article on using multiple definitions of the phrase, and a chart showing CDC's three "buckets" in which the concept of population health is described. The intent of the document and graphic were to demonstrate that population health is more of a spectrum and maybe a single definition does not work.</p> <p>Ultimately, the discussion centered around keeping the definition broad to mean the broader population versus the clinical subpopulation. However, for the benefit of the regional collaboratives there should be some discussion about how a clinic affects their subpopulations of patients' verses the broader population.
